Road Closed: R867 – Church Square, Monaghan (From Rossmore Monument to Church Square)

LS5515 – Lower Mill Street

Diversion Routes:

Westbound traffic approaching from Glaslough Street (N54-10) will be diverted at the Diamond (R867-1) left onto Dublin Street (N54-10) then take the 3rd exit at the roundabout at Old Cross Square onto Broad Road (N54-10) then right at the junction of Broad Road and Market Street onto Market Street (N54-8)
Eastbound traffic approaching from Dawson Street (N54-8) will be diverted straight ahead onto Church Square then right onto Mill Street (LS5515-0) then continue straight ahead onto The Diamond (R867-1)

- The proposed development will consist of:
- Construction of a new pedestrian and cycle bridge on the east side of the existing Ballybany Bridge. The new bridge will directly about the existing bridge. The new bridge will be joined to the existing bridge but will be supported independently via new piled abutments and new wingwalls.
 - Construction of new embankments on approaches to new bridge.
 - Construction of new timber post and rail fencing.
 - Construction of new kerb lines for new footpaths and cycle lanes/tracks.
 - Provision of shared areas for pedestrians and cyclists.
 - Provision of uncontrolled crossing points for pedestrians and cyclists.
 - Planting of trees and other soft landscaping.
 - Construction of new lighting.
 - Construction of over-ride areas and narrowing of the existing Park Road / Coolshannagh Walk junction.
 - Earthworks / excavations of existing roadways and verges, of existing roadway/footpaths, for service ducts and road crossings, etc.

- Construction of a new pedestrian and cycle bridge on the west side of the existing Horseshoe Bridge. The new bridge will directly about the existing bridge. The new bridge will be joined to the existing bridge but will be supported independently via new piled abutments and new wingwalls.
 - Construction of new embankments on approaches to new bridge.
 - Construction of new timber post and rail fencing.
 - Construction of new kerb lines for new footpaths and cycle lanes/tracks.
 - Provision of segregated cycling facilities.
 - Provision of shared areas for pedestrians and cyclists.
 - Provision of controlled crossing points for pedestrians and cyclists.
 - Planting of trees and other soft landscaping.
 - Provision of new lighting.
